

## COVID

- Continues to be low community levels would not be surprised if rises to medium
- Hospitalization continues to be a bit chaotic high earlier this week now lower
- Vaccination approaches 30% having received a booster
- Under 5 can now get a booster it's been ordered has started to come in will be ready to deliver to those who request next week
  - Only 17% having received monovalent so audience for this will not be large (national rate is under 5%)
- Therapeutics not a lot of new news Paxlovid is first line or remdesivir for those who can manage the infusion or molnupiravir (but not that effective)
- Repeating public messaging that now is the time to get COVID/flu vaccines before holiday gatherings, that sites have extended hours, beginning in January they will be reducing hours:

- Some schools requiring a doctor's note to say kids were sick to have an excused absence –
  hoping this is not a widespread policy let VDH know if this is a problem in your area

## Flu

- 1 of only 5 states not in high status but surrounded by a sea of "red" (high transmission) so it is here and likely to go up to high transmission in vt
- Tamiflu shortage is real but select can still find if call around but not a guarantee

- Don't bring your kid to ED/urgent care just to test to see what you/your kid has

## **RSV**

- All regions starting a downslope, including in VT
- Hospitals busy but not as stressed
- State continuing to provide support for EMS transport
- Have pool of 4 nurses and respiratory therapists available for critical access hospitals
- Request for nurse volunteers was successful (over 100 responses)
