This webinar will discuss two important, lifesaving forms of court protection from gun violence – **Extreme Risk Protection Orders** and **Relief From Abuse Orders**.

When a person is in crisis and considering harming themselves or others, family members and law enforcement are often the first people to see the warning signs. Vermont's **Extreme Risk Law** allows loved ones or law enforcement to intervene by petitioning a court for an order to temporarily prevent someone in crisis from accessing guns.

In situations where there is relationship violence, or violence in a household, Vermonters can also seek **Relief From Abuse (RFA) protective orders** from the court. This is an important form of protection for victims and survivors of violence – especially those who are seeking protection but reticent to report to law enforcement.
